**Lexar Media JumpDrive 2.0 Pro \$170**

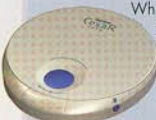

### Voice Recorder

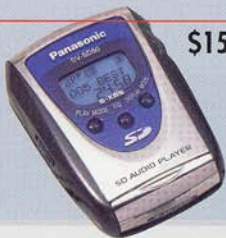
**Olympus W-10 \$100**
